As we approach the end of term one, the board of management would like to thank everyone for a wonderful term in Ennis Educate Together. The staff have been very busy this term availing of various continuous professional development opportunities including the Middle Leadership Project which took place over the last year and was completed on November 8th. The whole staff plan to do training on Trauma Informed Practice in term two. Two student teachers Róisín Travis and Philip Talty have recently completed their teaching practice in the school.

Throughout this term our students have been involved in many enriching activities off campus. In September our 4th, 5th and 6th classes took part in a TV programme called Uiscenauts in Athlone. This involved a number of challenges on an inflatable obstacle course at Bay Sports. Feedback from TG 4 was very positive. The programme will air in January and we look forward to seeing ourselves on TV!
