## Roots of Empathy:

The Roots of Empathy programme has started in 1st & 2nd class. Roots of Empathy is an international, evidence and empathy-based classroom program that teaches children about feelings, their own feelings and the feelings of others. Once every three weeks, baby and her parent will visit the classroom. This year our Baby Teacher is called Pippa and her Mum is Bernie. Please say hello and make them feel welcome anytime you see them in the school. The children are coached in observing and reading the cues the baby gives as to how the baby is feeling: "Is the baby happy or sad?" "How can you tell?" And we use this discussion as a lever for the children to talk about their own emotions and to understand how their classmates feel. Emotional literacy develops as children begin to identify and label the baby's feelings, reflect on and understand their own feelings, then bridge to understand the feelings of others.
