EAL Class 1:

Our EAL students have really enjoyed our spring season so far. In early March we learned about prepositions, St. Patrick's Day and Easter before moving on to Animals and Plants. We went on walks to explore the different plants and animals around our school grounds. We identified the different parts of the plant. We planted cress seeds and will be monitoring their growth over the coming weeks. We have read 'The Preposition Story' and 'The Frightened Little Rabbit' and sang songs like 'This is the way the Bunny Hops' and 'Five Green Shamrocks'. On a daily basis, we work on our vocabulary by revising our name, age, family, feelings, days of the week and months/seasons of the year. In Aistear we have learned about The Ocean, The Farm, St. Patrick's Day & Spring. We have added the 'j', 'x' and 'z' sounds to our list of phonics and our students continue to challenge us with words and phrases in their native languages. We are ready for summer weather now!
